**Building Healthy Families:** Suicide is among the leading causes of death for teens in the Midwest. In at least 90 percent of cases, depression, mental illness, or substance abuse are significant contributing factors. Young people who don't have the life experience to realize that periods of depression or relationship problems don't last forever may be overwhelmed by hopelessness. They're also prone to acting impulsively. In combination, these things create the perfect storm for a young person in trouble, increasing the risk that they would attempt suicide.
